Apart from the suffering of those directly caught up in it, the conflict between Israel and Palestinians in Gaza is distressing for its polarising effect much further afield. Yes, there have been extremist and prejudiced responses; but more generally there appears to be a premiss that you must be on one side or the other. Each cause, feeling itself to be under attack, has erected tightly-defined defences and is quick to identify those who are 'beyond the pale' (i.e. a fence, as in paling/palisade). It is hard to say anything publicly without laying oneself open to a charge of either antisemitism, or promoting the oppression of Palestinians, depending on the sentiments expressed or the precise words used. I don't want to identify with one group if it implies excluding the other: I want to recognise and respect the needs of all the inhabitants of that divided land.

In a conflict dominated by antagonistic, mostly male pronouncements, it was refreshing, on Ist March, to hear the voices of Palestinian Christian women, through the material prepared for this year's World Day of Prayer. Although composed long before the current escalation, the context was still the divided society within which they have lived for the last three guarters of a century. They drew their theme from the letter to the Ephesians: the call to bear with one another in love. The phrase itself (bearing with) implies the presence of a degree of difference (e.g. of character, or opinion) which might make loving a challenging approach. For these women it is a daily challenge, for difference confronts them every day. Their very identities defy polarisation, for they are Palestinian, but not Muslim; while some are Israeli citizens, but not lews. They are displaced people, yet continue to live alongside those who have displaced them. How much harder it must be since the violence of the Hamas incursion and the Israeli response! Yet Christ's call to love across boundaries remains, as the Samaritan in Jesus' parable crossed over the road of prejudice and difference to help the man robbers had left for dead.

Jesus wasn't immune to being asked polarising questions: Is it lawful to pay taxes to the Roman Emperor? Moses commanded such women should be stoned; what say you? Somehow he found a way not to answer directly, but to turn each question back on his accusers, forcing them to question their own position. Give to Caesar what is Caesar's; and to God what is God's. Let one who is without sin cast the first stone. (Jesus even asked a similar question himself, in the expectation it wouldn't be answered: John's Baptism: was it from heaven or of human origin?) When Jesus found himself under attack, he refrained from throwing up a palisade, but, in responding peacefully, respectfully, but challengingly, managed to remove the battleground from under his opponents' feet, redrawing the geography and reframing the question.

Church **Electoral Rolls** will be revised this month. No action is required if you are already on the Roll. If you would like to join and are eligible (baptized, live in the parish or worship habitually at the church) then submit an application form by the deadline date on the notice displayed at your parish church. The **Joint Annual Parochial Church Meeting** will be held on Sunday 12th May in Reedham Church, following a 9.30am Benefice Holy Communion.

Freethorpe (7th) and Wickhampton (15th) **Meetings of Parishioners for the election of churchwardens** will be held this month. Candidates need to be nominated and seconded on the official form (copies in churches) and declare that they are willing and eligible to stand; the form needs to be in the hands of the Rector before the start of the meeting.

Reedham Belles (Reedham and District WI)

This month, Giles Orpen- Smellie, the Norfolk Police Commissioner, spoke to us about the formation and history of the police force and how we have historic consent to be policed independently of the government and by allegiance to the monarch. His powers are wide but holding the Chief Constable to account plus budgetary setting/constraints are overriding factors. He wants Norfolk police to be visible and trusted by us. He discussed the social causes and underlying factors of domestic abuse and gave interesting statistics- in 2023 domestic violence represented 18-21% of all reported crime. In Norfolk we have the Norfolk Integrated Domestic Abuse Service (NIDAS) which ensures some continuity for victims. Our April speaker will be Stephen Maunder, an education officer at Norfolk County Council Trading Standards, who will talk to us about scams and how to protect ourselves. Consultation re Proposal for Reedham Primary and Nursery School 7. to join Consortium Academy Trust (Company number: 10255142)

Reedham Primary and Nursery School is a very small school (current roll 71 children aged 4-11) and an important part of the local community. The governors have a responsibility to secure its ongoing viability and, to this end, we have been exploring options for collaborating or partnering with other schools or finding a suitable multi-academy trust to join. Governors now feel they have found a suitable match and are proposing that the school joins Consortium Trust (Company Number: 10255142 – not to be confused with other academy trusts with the same name) as full members, having been associate members since September 2023. As we believe you may have an interest in the school, we are keen to hear your views about this proposal. Commemoration of the 80th Anniversary of the Bomber Crash 10.

On Wednesday 21st February 2024 the villagers of Reedham were joined by the USAF Honor Guard, representatives from USAF Mildenhall, the President of the 385th Bomb Group Association (USA), the Royal British Legion and veterans, for an act of Remembrance, conducted by The Reverend Martin Greenland, commemorating the 21 USAAF airmen who tragically lost their lives over Reedham Marshes 80 years to the day.

A poignant moment in the service was the laying of a basket containing 21 Snow Drops, by children from Reedham Primary School. When they had laid the basket, all three stepped back and bowed their heads in respect; the full significance of their beautiful gesture may not fully register with the innocence of a child, but it did amongst everyone who had gathered at the memorial as the Heavens cried upon us.

The memorial is forever a fitting tribute to our 21 airmen, all of whom had their calling over 80 years ago, coming together from all walks of life and places across the US, as thousands of others did. You can only imagine the heartbreak their families endured, knowing they would never see their faces or get to hug and kiss their loved ones again. A small event was held afterwards at the village hall, where refreshment, entertainment, and superb WW2 displays was provided.

The Event Team wish to extend their thanks and gratitude to everyone who has been involved in the making of a memorable day.
