From the (Reedham) Rectory

In last month's Outlook our Rector, Martin, talked about seeing the divine in the alltoo human story of Christ's suffering and death and I know that many of us did on Good Friday in Reedham. Five hundred people turned up to see it and, of course, we had a large team who were involved in it. One hundred and twelve people had been working together on the project. The Set Production team, the Make Up team, the Costume Designers and Makers, the Choir, the Musicians, the Catering team, the Publicity team, the Stage Management and Health and Safety team and last, but not least, the Cast, Director and Script writer of the play. The Passion Play went smoothly. The weather was just about perfect for such an event and there were no accidents or mishaps. I know that we all felt blessed and thanked God as we finished the Play and knew the event had been what we hoped for and more.

None of us, when we began this adventure fifteen months ago, had any idea of the amount of work, planning and rehearsal that would be involved, but we did enjoy it so. We had gathered together people from the surrounding villages, the eight churches in our Benefice, and actors, musicians and singers from all over Norfolk. A High Priest came in from London, Pilate's Assistant came from Cambridge and Disciples from Derbyshire, Dublin and Leeds. We all got on well together thanks to our patient Director, Simon, and our cheerful main Co-ordinator, Diana. Of course, there were issues and problems that arose but, somehow, we talked and discussed and sorted them out. Sometimes we even agreed to disagree and took the road of least argument.

Several amazing things came out of this project. First there was the response from the village of Reedham. We closed roads, we rehearsed through the streets and we brought a great crowd in on Good Friday but everyone supported us. There were no complaints. Second was the great benefit of people getting to know one another during the months we worked together. There were church members and people of other faiths and beliefs so we were a diverse group but it did not stop firm friendships being established. Perhaps the most important result of our Passion Play project was that we brought the story of Good Friday out into the streets. We saw the sham trial that Jesus went through, we saw the betrayal by Judas and the way his other disciples deserted him on the day. We saw his humiliation and dying and then we went home to wait for the resurrection.

For me, the whole project has been a humbling experience. I have been overwhelmed by the commitment, hard work, money and enthusiasm that everyone put into this. When I celebrated in Church on Easter Sunday morning I knew that we had really tried to walk with our Lord through that terrible time and I felt, as others did, the elation and joy of realising that he defeated death and returned whole and strong as our Saviour for all time.

Although we have had some warm days be wary of planting out summer bedding till at least the middle of May. Cut vigorous climbers back such as honeysuckle. Plants suitable for the show can be set, such as dahlias, summer flowering bulbs, annuals, fuchsias etc.

In the vegetable garden beans, peas, leeks, courgettes and brassicas can be planted. Tomatoes, cucumber, peppers and lettuce seed can be grown in the greenhouse.

Meeting held on Monday 3rd April 2017 at Reedham Village Hall

There were 7 Councillors present and the Clerk. Also present was Mr Bradbury from the Village Hall Committee. 6 members of the public were in attendance. District Councillor Grant Nurden and County Councillor Brian Iles sent their apologies. The Council meeting commenced at 7.30 pm

The Council co-opted Simon Pittam, Jenny Ball and Rebecca Grattan as Parish Councillors.

The Chairman of the Village Hall Committee Chris Bradbury gave the following report:

Fibre optic broadband has finally been installed. Fund raising: the cash bingo jackpot stands at $\pounds 160$ in 46 numbers or less. Upcoming events are: a quiz on the 14^{th} April, and a Murder Mystery, Have You Got a Clue, on the 28^{th} April.

The closure of the permissive path was again discussed. Councillors David Hale and Chris Ward, and County Councillor Brian Iles met Mr Chris Mutten, the landowner, and representatives from the Broads Authority and Norfolk County Trails to view the path and discuss the options. Mrs Pat Bagshaw also attended. The Broads Authority will provide labour free of charge for the installation of the new fixtures and fittings but cannot fit it into their schedules until 2018. A new agreement needs to be put in place before any work can commence.

The fence posts on the allotment damaged by Storm Doris have been replaced.

There is a pile of garden manure at the allotments and residents are invited to help themselves.

There is also a $\frac{1}{2}$ plot available at the allotments. Please contact Paul Bilverstone or the Clerk for further details.

The glass recycling bins will be removed in the next month.
