From the Rectory

At the beginning of February the Church celebrates the Presentation of Christ in the temple at Jerusalem. Taken by his parents, the infant Jesus is met by two elderly, devout people: Simeon and Anna. Simeon believed by the Holy Spirit that he wouldn't die until he had seen the Messiah; when he takes Jesus in his arms, he knows his time of waiting is over: 'Now, Lord, you are letting your servant depart in peace, according to your word.'

For Simeon, seeing Jesus marks the completion of his life. Not just in the sense of the end of his years, but also in the sense of fulfilment, purpose: this meeting makes Simeon's life complete. 'With my own eyes have I seen God's salvation.'

There is great peace to be found in a sense of completion; but how hard it is to achieve! So much of life speaks of incompleteness. Advertisers tell us our lives are incomplete without their products: yet they never satisfy us for long. When one task is achieved, another springs up in its place. The world moves on, leaving us trying to catch up. I don't know where we'll be with Brexit by the time you read this, but whatever the course (acceptable deal, no deal or delay) I know the process won't be complete by 29th March – much will remain to be resolved well beyond that date.

With God, however, it is different. In Christ, Christians see the completion of all things: the fulfilment of God's love and purpose for his creation. Nothing more is needed.

The last service of the Church's day is called *Compline* – 'completion'. In prayer we offer to God not only what we've done that day, but what we've left incomplete; and in him we find our rest.

Jesus shows us we don't have to achieve anything to come to him: we don't have to tie up all our loose ends. Whatever age we are, in meeting Jesus, we too can find our completion.



REEDHAM PARISH COUNCIL

Meeting held on Monday 7^{th} January 2019 at Reedham Village Hall

There were 9 Councillors present, the Clerk, County Councillor Brian Iles and District Councillor Grant Nurden. 4 members of the public were in attendance. Apologies were received from Councillors Case and Grattan. The Council meeting commenced at 7.30 pm County Councillor Iles informed the Council that his Highways budget will be spent on flooding issues in his parishes. Following the query last meeting regarding the pot holes on the Halvergate Road, pot holes are allocated time and money for repair and when the limit on either one or both is reached the work stops and any pot holes not filled have to wait for the next allocation.

District Councillor Nurden reported that the new Broadland and South Norfolk District Council Managing Director is looking to implement a single management structure. Internal consultations have begun. Through the Warm Homes Fund, Norfolk Councils, led by Broadland, are offering funding towards the cost of installing first time central heating in privately rented or owned homes. The central heating will be at no cost to eligible home owners with up to 75% grant funding for landlords with qualifying tenants. You are likely to qualify if your home has no central heating (this includes home currently heated by storage heaters, electric radiators, open fires or gas fires) and/or if you have a low income or receive certain benefits

The Chairman of the Village Hall Committee Chris Bradbury gave the following report: there were no issues with the play equipment safety inspection for January. The Little Miss Muffet play bridge and the new fitness equipment will be installed on the 18th February. The December Cash Bingo jackpot was not won, the jackpot now stands at £260 in 56 numbers or less. The RCA Stage School set up in September performed their first Showcase just before Christmas. The audience of over 100 people were very impressed by the children's performance and it was enjoyed by all. The film The February film will be "A Star is Born", the 2018 version. The Christmas Quiz Night was very well attended and the next Quiz Night is on the 6th February.

Notification had been received of a re-consultation on the planning application for a new shed at Sanderson Marine Craft and 4 houses on the old boat yard adjacent. It was only received on Friday which is not enough time to look at the documents. An additional meeting to discuss the application is expected.

There are currently 2 half plots available at the allotments. Please contact the Clerk for further details. The Allotment Committee is offering support and advice to those new to allotments.

Another meeting was held in December to progress the reopening the Permissive Path. It is hoped that the Parish Council and landowner are close to a final agreement.

Beighton Restoration & Improvements Appeal

Work on the project has been moving on in the past few months. Detailed drawings and specifications were created by the architect and sent to the Heritage Lottery Fund for approval. They passed without one single query - such a contrast to our previous experience! This meant we could go to tender and the five interested contractors all returned priced tenders. These ranged from £267,187 to £396,727 - ouch! Bearing in mind this was without fees on top ... After discussions with the architect and quantity surveyor, some of the work was scaled back to get it down to what was felt to be a realistic working budget of £229,500 for the delivery of project. Again plus fees, activities and other costs, bringing the total grant-eligible costs based on the lowest tender to £325,982. Anticipated funding for this is as follows:

Put simply, we need to find £31,083. If all the funding is in place, there is a good chance work can begin in late summer.
