I'm writing this in the cosy glow of Christmas preparations and celebrations. In my imagination, the light which shines through December is warm and red and soft in tone – like the candlelight of many a carol service. But this piece will most likely be read in January, when the decorations come down and the characteristic light shifts to the other end of the spectrum and the blue, cold light of day. As the days grow longer, the cold grows stronger, Norfolk farmer and broadcaster Chris Skinner reminds his listeners each New Year.

The Church keeps the glow going longer than most, ending the twelve days of Christmas with the celebration of the visit of the Magi on the feast of The Epiphany. But the stream of e-mails and cycle of meetings, school assemblies, etc. is quick to resume.

On the first Sunday following The Epiphany the Church celebrates the Baptism of Christ. Thirty years after his birth, Jesus emerges from obscurity, and the water of the Jordan, to receive an assurance of his Father's love and to embark on his ministry. The divine message of love, hope, peace and joy conveyed in the story of Bethlehem is to be shown to be valid as it is worked out in the cold light of day: in the daily life of Galilee, and then in the political hothouse of Jerusalem.

This festival tends to get bypassed in our Benefice, as we mark Plough Sunday at Wickhampton Church. Traditionally this was the day before work resumed after the Christmas holiday: the plough was blessed before embarking on its task of slicing into the cold ground. The most significant mention of a plough in the Gospels is when Jesus says to a would-be follower, 'No one who sets his hand to the plough and then looks back is fit for the kingdom of God.'

There is plenty of forward-looking work to be done every January. On a national scale, even more so this year. As we leave the European Union, Parliament will have to get to grips with re-casting our relationships with both the EU and other countries around the world. Our legislation, standards and border protocols will need to be overhauled. It's a chance to determine what kind of a nation we want to (continue to?) be. The classic hallmarks of Christmas – peace and goodwill and concern for the disadvantaged – need to be borne out into the New Year. We need leaders as wise as those who bowed before the infant king, recognising his authority on the international scene. At least we know that God (Emanuel) is still with us; but will we still be with him?

Reedham Primary School

Consultation Process for Early Years Provision at Reedham Primary School. From April 2020 we are proposing to operate an early years provision without lowering the school-age of admission via the statutory process, instead using the means of a Section 27 process. The early years provision will be run by governors as a separate entity as opposed to being part of the whole school.

Norfolk Swift Response

This 24 hour service provides help, support and reassurance if you have an urgent, unplanned need at home but don't need the emergency services.

So for example, if your partner or carer is suddenly admitted to hospital, the Swift Response team can assist you with getting up, washing and dressing. Or if you have a fall but are not seriously injured, the team can bring special lifting equipment to help make moving as safe as possible for you.

When Fred (73) had a fall, he pressed his alarm pendant for help. He wasn't seriously injured and didn't need an ambulance, so the Norfolk Swift team came to help him. They used inflatable lifting equipment to help him up off the floor and made sure he was OK. Because Fred had had a previous fall, the Swifts suggested a referral to the Falls Team to look at ways of reducing the risk of falls around the home.
