September means "Back to School". This year the phrase takes on a whole new significance: the Government is making the reopening of schools for all pupils a priority. If this increases the spread of Coronavirus, we've been warned that other forms of activity may need to be curtailed. As with so much these days, we'll just have to see.

In a wider sense, this pandemic has sent all of us "back to school". Many of us have learnt new skills, mostly relating to technology (cashless payments; video calls; on-line shopping; virtual meetings). That's not always easy. Although the practicalities can be challenging, especially to those who've not grown up with them, often the greatest hurdle is an internal resistance — "I've got this far in life without x — why should I have to learn it now?" The answer, of course, is changed circumstances. Once you get over the inner hurdle and grasp the basics, things become possible which weren't before and life can be the richer for it.

Not only have we been learning new things; we've had to relearn things we thought we already knew. After years of ministry, I thought I knew how to conduct a funeral. But the challenges of lockdown, with no visit beforehand, restricted attendances and even graveside services, made me feel like a beginner again. We've all been having to relearn how to do basic tasks with the restrictions of social distancing, face coverings and the like.

One of the commonest titles for Jesus during his ministry was "Teacher". In Christian thought it tends to get supplanted by other, weightier titles, like Saviour, Christ and Lord. Yet we still learn from his teaching as we read the Gospels – particularly through these Sundays after Trinity. Jesus' teaching isn't about imparting a body of knowledge: it's rather about transformation: changing our perspective on life, ourselves, others, and the things of God. Like all good teachers, he asks as many questions as he answers: he wants us to work things out for ourselves. In the words of Mary's song, Jesus brought down the mighty and exalted the lowly. He set about opening eyes – metaphorically as much as physically. Those who thought they already knew it all were often given short shrift, and told there were lessons they needed to relearn. Like this present time, Jesus' teaching is often challenging; but the witness of Christians through the ages is that our lives are the richer for it.

#### Reedham Gardening Club

September is usually a gustier and cooler month than August and the days become noticeably shorter. Start planning and planting spring bulbs, herbaceous perennials can still be divided, also continue to feed and deadhead hanging baskets and containers. Continue to harvest fruit and vegetables. Cut back spent french beans, pea & runner bean plants at ground level as they will release nitrogen back into the ground. To stop pumpkins and gourds from rotting place them onto an old tile or a piece of wood.

Create a new lawn by using turf or seed.

#### New Governors needed for Reedham Primary.

Reedham Primary School is seeking co-opted Governors to assist in setting the direction of the school. The school takes a proactive approach to ensuring appropriate resources from our balanced budget are applied to the benefit of the pupils and indirectly the wider school community.

Governing bodies are responsible for the strategic management of a school and will make decisions about a wide range of issues, taking into account the individual qualities of the school.

The core responsibilities involved are:

- · Ensuring accountability
- Acting as a 'critical friend' to the Head Teacher
- Monitoring and evaluating the school's progress
- · Budgetary allocation and control
- Shaping plans for school improvement and overseeing the implementation
- · Setting the school's aims and values
- Appointing senior members of staff including the Head Teacher

A school governing body is made up of representatives from the school, the parents, the local authority and the local community.

The Governing Body at Reedham operates as an open forum for all Governors to have an input on the collective decisions. There is currently only one permanent subcommittee (Finance and Premises) for which the successful new Governor may be elected to dependent on their relevant skills. Ad-hoc additional committees are formed as appropriate to the expertise required on specific projects.

#### What are we looking for?

Essential skills are ability to work as part of team, commitment to 'collective responsibility' and the ability to think strategically. An interest to make a difference to local children's education is also key. Other skills such as finance, legal, HR and general business skills can be very valuable additions to a governing body.

#### What difference will you make?

Governors perform the most important voluntary role in education and a full and diverse governing body can be a source of enormous strength to a school.

Governors provide an external perspective and an ability to challenge assumptions and look for the best solutions. They bring enthusiasm, experience and expertise from other areas of life and can act together as a well balanced group of people to effectively support the Head Teacher and staff to drive the school forward.

#### What is in it for the volunteer?

Volunteering as a governor is a great way to contribute to your local community, meet new people and improve the lives of local children. You will develop transferable skills and learn more about the education system whilst putting existing skills and experience to good use. Full training is available and no direct experience is required. However an enthusiasm and commitment to make a difference to our local community will definitely help.


