## **From the Rectory**

With Easter Day on 5th April, this letter clearly needed to carry an Easter message. But with all the unpredictability of war in the Middle East as I write, I can only wonder what state the world will be in come the beginning of April.

This year the month opens on the Wednesday of Holy Week. I imagine many a priest encourages their congregations to participate in the midweek observance of Maundy Thursday and Good Friday, in order to appreciate more fully the message of Easter Day. In the Gospels it is the women who faithfully accompanied Jesus from Galilee who are the model disciples in this regard: not deserting their Lord, but staying with him to the end, albeit at a distance; their witness of his death and burial leading to them being privileged with the first evidence of his ever-so-unexpected resurrection.

Luke and John emphasise that Jesus' resurrected body bore the marks of his crucifixion in his hands and feet, or side. It's an indication that the meaning of the resurrection is rooted in the events of Good Friday. Because Jesus endured persecution, jeers and torture without retaliation, even praying for his persecutors, his resurrection proclaims that love is stronger than hatred – a message for those who think they can brandish the cross aggressively on our streets today. Because Jesus was nailed to a cross and sealed in a tomb, his resurrection can speak of the possibility of freedom to those who feel or find themselves unjustly restricted, confined or oppressed. Because of the despair of that day, Jesus' resurrection affirms that tears of sorrow can turn to tears of joy; and speaks a message of enduring hope into situations where it seems most remote.

Yes, lambs, chicks and spring flowers are welcome seasonal indications of new life; but Jesus' Easter message was forged in a place of darkness, depravity, death and despair – and therefore speaks more powerfully in a broken world of the light, forgiveness, life and joy to be found in him. And that is something we need to hear this – and every other year.

Meeting held on Monday 2nd March 2026 in the Village Hall

There were 9 Councillors present, the Clerk, District Councillor Nurden and 46 members of the public.

The Clerk gave an update to the Council:

The Broadland tree warden network has closed.

The new Village Hall defibrillator and the new finger post at Witton Green have been installed.

The Keith Sales Memorial bench has been delivered and will be installed on the agreed site on Mill Road near to the village sign. The memorial trophy has been engraved with the wording 'Keith Sales Memorial Cup, Practical Achievement Award' and will be presented by the school in July.

D. Cllr Nurden advised that the Norfolk County Council elections are on 7th May 2026.

Cllr Hale read out an email from the Academy Head of Reedham Primary School, Beth Spaul, advising the Council that she will be leaving the school at the end of the spring term.

Mark Burgess and Mandy Goddard were coopted onto the Council, and each signed the Declaration of Acceptance of Office at the meeting.

An increase in dog fouling has been reported on social media and observed by the Clerk and councillors.

Five additional PSPO notices were supplied free of charge by Broadland District Council. The issue will be discussed with the police at the Annual Parish Meeting.

Cllr Hale reported on the A47 construction progress update meeting:

The road should be partially open from 16th March 2026 and fully open 6th May 2026.

Additional works to be completed over the summer.

In January the speed sensor was located on Mill Road, facing North, near the junction with Church View Close, collecting data from traffic coming towards the school. The speed limit here is 30mph. The 85th percentile was 28 mph; the average speed was 22.6 mph. The average vehicles per day was 459.

In February the speed sensor was located on Freethorpe Road near Station Drive collecting data from traffic entering the village. The speed limit here is 30mph. The 85th percentile was 32.8 mph; the average speed was 26.9 mph. The average vehicles per day was 498.

Reedham Parish Council will be taking part in The Big Broadland Litter Pick on Saturday 18th April at 10.30am. The District Council supply bags, litter picking tools and high vis vests. Everyone is welcome to come along and help, complimentary refreshments will be served in the Village Hall after the litter pick.

The Annual Parish Meeting will be held in the Village Hall on Thursday 16th April, starting at 6pm with an informal evening session. Local organisations, community groups and members of the public are invited to attend, share information, and meet with each other and with the Parish Council, with complimentary refreshments provided.
