View from the Pew

Dear Friends,

What strange times we seem to be living in – everything's the same, and nothing's the same! People are desperately wanting to go on as though Covid never happened and yet, as soon as we start mixing in greater numbers, the infection rate rises ever higher. We just want to get back to being who we were pre-Covid, don't we? But who is that?

I've been musing about the church season – we are now in the 'weeks after Trinity' (or 'Ordinary, or Proper Time' as the Lectionary has it) and Trinity is, of course the time we celebrate the Three Persons of God – Father, Son & Holy Spirit. And, we're told in the bible, we're made in God's image so I got to wondering if we, too, might be more than one person.

If you were to ask different people who Vic Walsham is (that's me, by the way) you'd probably get a range of answers, depending on how they come to know me – someone from St Edmund's church might say "he's our Lay Minister", whereas someone who goes to the Canasta Group I lead might well say "he's the one who teaches us and cajoles us into trying to play better", and again, someone who knows me through the 49+ Club (Acle-based club for the young-at-heart) you might be told "Oh, he's the one who's always there acting the fool"!

All somewhat different aspects of the one person – but which one is the real Vic Walsham? Well, does it really matter? Because he's all of those things – and none of them or, at least, not just one of them.

And, I feel, that's the way it is with the Trinity – God is the supreme Holy Being; He is the one who teaches, encourages and cajoles us; and He is (not the one who acts the fool) the one who's always there for us (in the Holy Spirit).

I remember when preaching on Trinity Sunday some years ago, I likened the Trinity to a bottle of wine I'd bought which was called 'Trilogie' because it was made using three different grapes (Marsanne, Chardonnay and Jacquere). I explained that, while the qualities of each grape could be appreciated, the wine had a unique taste in its own right (and in my opinion it was superb).

I learned (from a wine writer with the wonderful name 'Wink Lorch' – Google her) that, in fact, all wines develop their distinctive taste from three key elements – weather, 'terroir' (means 'sense of place') and the vigneron (winemaker).

So, I wonder, how many different persons are you? How might you be defined by someone who knows you? And, more importantly, who will you choose to be today? Cheers!

The Anglican Church in Menton – see back cover for picture.

The Anglican Church in Menton was established almost 150 years ago to provide a place of worship and pastoral care for the large British population that visited regularly to enjoy the sunshine along the Cote d'Azur. Over a period of time, that visiting community became established, and the "English Church" became a thriving centre within the town.

It forms part of the enormous Diocese of Europe, with the Bishop based in Brussels – one of 83 chaplaincies within the Archdeaconry of France. The parish stretches from Nice (25 miles to the west) over the border into Italy. There is no resident incumbent – the church exists in a state akin to a permanent interregnum, relying on the peripatetic services of visiting priests.

We have visited as holidaymakers on a number of occasions over the years, and always enjoyed a warm welcome before and after the service. This year there were some familiar and endearing features. The priest's wife had COVID so we missed out on Communion and instead celebrated Morning Prayer from the Book of Common Prayer. The organist had failed to materialise so the hymns were sung with vigour a cappella, led by a member of the congregation whose sense of pitch proved borderline ambitious. The service was conducted by a newly-appointed Churchwarden whose success was confirmed when everyone finished at the same time. A final spiritual uplift came afterwards in the form of a large glass of Prosecco.

It was indeed a privilege to join with them in worship and to know that the Church – and in particular the BCP – is alive and well 1000 miles from home.

Reedham Gardening Club - August jobs in the garden

Sow hardy annuals, deadhead, water and feed hanging baskets and container plants as this will prolong the plants till well into autumn.

Collect seeds from annuals and perennials.

Keep vigilant for the appearance of tomato and potato blight.

Plant up strawberry runners.

Harvest fresh herbs to freeze in ice cubes for winter use or hang them to dry then store in jars.
