Comments from the convent

During August our main convent in Southsea closes for routine maintenance. Skirting boards are painted and carpets are cleaned, the whole house is transfigured, ready to receive guests in September. This seems to be a month of being transfigured – wheat and barley fields turn from green to gold, hedgerows begin to bear blackberries, many holidaymakers turn from pink to brown, and school uniforms can change ahead of a new term.

I use the word '*transfigure*' on purpose. It means the change in appearance of a person or thing, usually in a positive way. On the 6th August a major celebration in the Church's year takes place, it's called 'The Transfiguration'. Jesus' appearance, His face and clothes, change to a dazzling white. It is a significant moment in His life and work.

This month also sees twelve Saints or holy people remembered including Mary Sumner, founder of the Mothers' Union, and John Bunyan, author of *The Pilgrim's Progress*. As Jesus was transfigured they were transfigured too by their life with Him. As I first encountered Jesus in my 30's I recall a work colleague asking me why I looked different, why I looked 'better'. 'It's something to do with a man, isn't it?' he asked. I then told him it was but of course he wasn't expecting the man to be Jesus!

As Jesus was transfigured He can also transfigure us, changing loneliness into deep contentment, anxiety into deep peace, sadness into a deep hope and even joy; so our appearance changes as we change within. We are transfigured, not by a lick of paint but in a way that lasts for ever; we will never be the same.

Jobs in the garden for August

August generally is one of the hottest months of the year, water container plants with grey water or rainwater collected in water buttsfrom our deluge in July.

Collect seeds, as they ripen, from Aquilega, Sweet peas and Nigella. Deadhead Dahlias, summer perennials and bedding plants to ensure continued blooms.

Lift onions and shallots once their tops die down and leave to dry in the sun.

Harvest Potatoes, Runner beans, Carrots.

Pot up strawberry runners to give you new plants for next year. You can still sow quick maturing salad crops such as summer lettuce, radish, rocket, sorrel, chicory and fennel.
