In their different ways, gospel writers Luke and Matthew each show us a Christmas story which is off-centre. In Luke's more familiar account, most of the people in Bethlehem, let alone the wider area, were oblivious to the baby in a manger. Most had no room in their lives to accommodate the birth of Jesus. Yet Luke shows us those who made space: the shepherds responding to the angel's invitation to go and see; Mary pondering the meaning of it all in her heart.

For the majority of the inhabitants of our country, one suspects that Jesus' nativity appears as little more than a sideshow amongst all the other 'stuff' which constitute our increasingly secular midwinter festival. Yet each Christmas the Church welcomes enhanced numbers of worshippers, for whom celebrating and reflecting on the Saviour's birth is an important, if not essential element; while the angels' message of peace and goodwill to all is reflected in increased charitable and inclusive activity in the wider community.

While Luke's narrative focuses on the local and personal, Matthew gives us a political and universal perspective. An impressive foreign delegation comes to the King's palace to initiate positive relations with a rising star on the global political scene. They've come to the wrong place: the child is not in Jerusalem, but in off-centre Bethlehem. Herod sees in this a challenge to his rule; and takes underhand and increasingly desperate measures to neutralise the opposition.

Power can be exercised for the general good; yet it brings with it the temptation to misuse it, or to hold on to it for one's own ends. Through his ministry and death, Jesus will go on to show a different kind of realm and a different way of ruling: a preview of a world centred on God, which he calls, according to Matthew, the kingdom of heaven. In terms of this world, this kingdom is also off-centre. While political manifestos, technological progress and consumer offers may look as though they promise heaven on earth, human fallibility and sin teach us that consistently they fail to deliver. Rather than a world evolving towards the kingdom of God, much of Jesus' Advent teaching implies that the final arrival of that kingdom will represent a dramatic change from the way things are and a painful wrench for the powers that be – like the birth of a child.

Yet the signs of that age, Jesus taught, are and will be all around, until that kingdom come – although often off-centre: hidden, or amongst unexpected people. Wherever love is shown, or truly inclusive community demonstrated; where there is hope for the oppressed, forgiveness for the sinner or compassion for the afflicted; wherever lives are truly centred on God. He taught us, his followers, to pray daily for that kingdom's coming: to be alert for it, to seek it out and to live it.

The true message of Christmas may be off-centre for the world: but, as we gather around the manger throne, it needs to be central for us.

Exciting news. We have introduced an online Entry Form so that you can now enter from home. Just go to cantley.org/flowershow, download the Entry Form and follow the simple instructions. See you in September 2024. Robert. Meeting held on Monday 6th November 2023 in the Village Hall. There were 8 Councillors present, the Clerk, and 2 members of the public. The meeting commenced at 7.30pm

Chairman of the Village Hall Committee Chris Bradbury gave the following report:

There were no issues with the play equipment safety inspection for November.

Unfortunately, due to illness the defibrillator training from the Freethorpe First Responders in October had to be cancelled. It is likely to be rearranged for the New Year.

The October Cash Bingo jackpot wasn't won; therefore the jackpot for November stands at £250 in 59 numbers or less.

On Saturday 2nd December we have a Christmas Party, from 5pm to 10pm. There will be a disco including an entertainer, Santa's Grotto, and carols round the tree.

Bonfire Night was very well attended with the largest number of people we have ever had come to see the fireworks display. Cllr Hale thanked the Community Association and all involved for their work in putting on an excellent event and firework display.

There were 2 planning applications for consideration:

2023/3096 – single storey rear extension & associated internal reordering works at Oaklea 37B Witton Green, NR13 3HH. The Council were in favour of the application.

BA/2023/0405/HOUSEH – first floor extension and internal alterations at Reedling Cottage, 46 Riverside. The Council were in favour of the application.

I application was received for the remaining Parish Councillor vacancy. Mr Robert Allen was coopted on to the Council.

The Council adopted a Biodiversity Policy, which can be viewed on the website.

In September the sensor was located at the top of Station Drive facing Freethorpe. The 85th percentile was 27.1mph, in September 2022 it was 31.1mph. The average number of vehicles per day was 369, fewer than last year.

In October it was on Station Road looking north up towards the station. The average number of cars was 795 per day, double last year's figures. It is possible the data has been affected by heavy rain. The 85th percentile was 27mph, about the same as the last time it was there.

Work on the Woodland Walk steps handrail will start soon. A working party will also clear some of the undergrowth.

Several updates were received from County Councillor Lana Hempsall on some outstanding Highways issues:

- works to alleviate the flooding issues on Witton Green have been programmed into the current schedule of works but there is not a timeframe for when they will be completed yet.
- works to shore up Church Dam are unlikely to take place. The road does not serve any people
 or houses and Highways cannot find any funding for the repair. The overhanging hedge from
 Pettitts will be cut back.
- the closure of Middle Hill to through traffic is going ahead although a final plan has not yet been agreed.

The Council will be organising an 80th commemoration of the downing of the two B17 bombers over the marshes on the 21st February 2024. If anyone would like to assist in this please contact the Clerk.

The Clerk has tendered her resignation due to an increase in hours at her other Council. If anyone is interested in the role, please contact the Clerk or Chairman.

Time and Date of Next Meeting.

Monday 4^{th} December 2023 at 7.30pm in the Village Hall. Further details will be published on the website, Facebook page and noticeboard by the Doctor nearer the time. All parishioners are welcome to attend.

Rake up accumulated fallen leaves in borders that could be harbouring slugs and other pests. Plant bare root Roses and other deciduous shrubs, plus ornamental trees. Hard prune overgrown shrubs and hedges while they're dormant. Check stored bulbs and corms regularly for any signs of rot. Lift and divide large clumps of Rhubarb, replanting the outer sections into soil enriched with well-rotted manure. Keep kale, winter cabbages and other brassicas covered with netting to protect them from hungry pigeons. Finish clearing old crops and debris from the veg plot, but only compost healthy material.

Start to plan next year's crops and order seeds and bulbs to give you a fantastic display in 2024.

We have been looking recently at the future of Outlook magazine. We are doing this because:

- for the last couple of years we have made a loss in the region of £500 p.a. and we
 cannot sustain that, especially as costs continue to rise & our printer is beginning to
 wear out;
- the labour of producing 850 copies per month is becoming too onerous; and
- as an 'Eco Church' we are concerned about the environmental implications 600 of the 850 copies printed per month are distributed free to each household in Reedham, & we think that many of these go into waste or recycling, unread. We want to address this.

Accordingly:

The price will rise to 50p per copy from January (the first price rise for years, & at £6 per year still less than a couple of coffee shop coffees). Outlook continues to be available **free** on the Benefice website, & can be sent by e-mail on request to the editor. For Reedham residents, from April 2024 we will cease the monthly free distribution to every household. Paper copies will still be available on subscription – details of how to subscribe in the next Outlook. We are exploring with the Parish Council the possibility of a free distribution perhaps twice a year.
