I've just totted up: I'm participating in 20-odd Carols / Christmas services this year – and there are a few more I'm unable to attend. Venues include all 8 of our churches (including Cantley on Sun 14^{th}); Freethorpe Village Hall (Sun 7th) and several residential facilities (e.g. Swallowtail Place on Fri 19^{th} – open to visitors). Some are outside (e.g. Reedham Riverside on Thu 18^{th}); some are with schools. Musical styles will vary: Gospel Choir (Sun 7^{th}), our Benefice Choir (Mon 22^{nd}), a folk band and plenty of community/congregational singing! Most appear in the table elsewhere in this magazine and on abychurches.co.uk

It's fitting that there should be carol services all over the place, because Jesus' birth is a local event. Okay, he had to be born somewhere and that place was Bethlehem – and there is royal significance in that location. But in a way Bethlehem represents anywhere: according to Luke, it wasn't Joseph and Mary's home; nor was it somewhere with restricted access, like Herod's palace (where the Magi went by mistake). The first to welcome the child were shepherds from the fields, of no particular fixed abode.

Wherever we are, whoever we are, the Son of God is born in our midst; born as one of us. He shares our human lot (as the Revised English Bible translates the hymn in Philippians 2). Before they departed, the shepherds spread the word among the local populace – this birth which is, as the angel declared, good news for all people.

The invitation to you is to come along to one or more(!) of these local celebrations, joining with your neighbours in welcoming God's Son into our communities; and the love, peace, hope and joy he brings. In the love of God.

Heather and I moved to Reedham in September 2014. We soon met folk who had sung in choirs that I had conducted in Norwich twenty or more years previously and, together with other singers from across East Norfolk, we formed a small choir which gave its first performance in Reedham Church on Good Friday 2015. The programme included motets, anthems and readings suitable for that important day in the life of the Christian church. It had the title Tenebrae (Darkness). The coming together of this group of singers coincided with the inauguration of the Acle and Bure to Yare Benefice and the first Rector of the group, the Reverend Martin Greenland, himself an excellent tenor, was an enthusiastic member.

Other projects followed: a Carol Service (2015), a performance of Faure's Requiem (2016), both at Reedham, a special service at Wickhampton (2016) and an Epiphany Carol Service at Halvergate (2017). In that last year, the Choir also took part in the amazing Reedham Passion Play, performed by a large cast at five different outdoor locations in the village. That year, the Choir made its first appearance at Norwich Cathedral and has since returned several times at the Cathedral's request to provide music for a service for which the Cathedral Choir has not been available. In the years since, the Choir has also performed at Acle and Beighton within the Benefice and at the Cathedral at Bury St Edmunds.

Over the years, we have increasingly abbreviated the name of the choir to ABY Choir. The organisation of the Choir remains as it was at the start - by invitation to singers whose names are on a list of over forty men and women, with twenty-five to thirty able to take part each time. The invitation will set out the date and place of the service or concert and the list of rehearsals, usually five or six on Monday evenings at St Edmund's Church, Acle (or adjacent Parish Hall). Rehearsals do not normally continue after an event until the time of the next occasion. Less than one third of our members actually live within the Benefice. It would be good to have stronger support locally. However, we have benefited greatly from those who live further afield. Some live widely across East Norfolk, several come from Norwich, some even west of Norwich and a few from neighbouring parts of Suffolk.

Why not give it a try (Tel: 01493 700819 for further information)? There is no audition but prospective members are very welcome. They are likely to feel more comfortable if they have had some previous experience of singing in a group and can read music reasonably well.

By the time that you read this, we shall have celebrated our tenth anniversary with a special service celebrating St Edmund at Acle Church and will be rehearsing for our Carol Service at Beighton on 22 December. Next year brings a visit to sing at Ely Cathedral and two or three occasions to enhance the worship within the seven churches of the Acle and Bure to Yare Benefice.

Meeting held on Monday 3rd November 2025 in the Village Hall. There were 11 Councillors present, the Clerk, District Councillor Nurden and 1 member of the public.

The Clerk gave an update to the Council:

The railings around the War Memorial have been painted. Poppy wreaths have been delivered ready for the service on Sunday 9th November.

The loose grit on Middle Hill has been reported to Highways.

The allotments notice board has been delivered and installed. Thanks are due to Acle Men's Shed for their work in making and fitting it.

D. Cllr Nurden advised that Reedham Community Association have been awarded a grant of approximately £9000 from the Community Grant Scheme to replace wooden doors and windows at the village hall.

The Council have been notified that the Barn Owl Close phase 2 construction has been scheduled to start on 1st December.

Cllr George gave an update on the plans for the village Christmas tree:

The Christmas tree has been sourced and a location on Riverside confirmed.

Sponsorship letters have been sent out, and some donations have already been received. The tree will be erected on Sunday 30th November, and volunteers are invited to come along and lend a hand.

Events have been planned to include the Christmas lights switch-on taking place Thursday 4th December at 6pm, and a school event on 11th December. Carol singing on 18th December to be confirmed.

Freethorpe First Responders will cease to exist after the end of 2025, responsibility for the defibrillators will pass to the Parish Council on 1st January 2026. A £1,000 contribution will be made to the Parish Council by the First Responders to support the defibrillator takeover. CPR & Defibrillator training has been arranged to take place at the village hall on Saturday 22nd November 12pm. Donations to Heart2Heart on the day.

In October the speed sensor was located on Station Road, near the sharp bend, facing North. The speed limit here is 30mph. The 85th percentile was 29.6 mph; the average speed was 21.4 mph. The average vehicles per day was 433.

At the meeting Cllr Diane Rushbrook advised the Council of her retirement from the Parish Council, confirming that this would be her final meeting. Diane has served on the Council for nearly 50 years and was also village news correspondent for the Mercury for over 40 years. The Council thanked her for her long and dedicated service to the parish and extended its best wishes for the future.

Time and Date of Next Meeting

The next scheduled meeting of the Parish Council is Monday 1st December at 7.30pm, in the Village Hall lounge. Further details will be published on the website, Facebook page and notice board by the Doctors nearer the time. All parishioners are welcome to attend.

Members of the branch have been all over the district supporting the various Remembrance Services taking place. It was especially poignant to see a large gathering including pupils from Acle Academy and residents from The Old Rectory around the war memorial on the 11th November. The last post echoed across the road to some of the workmen who had stopped work to pay their respects.

The Poppy Appeal has been well received and we are very grateful for the support from the members of the public, all of the businesses, churches and schools throughout the area. At this moment in time, we are in the process of counting and will be able to announce the total raised in the next issue.

The Seasiders Ukulele Band (see picture on the back cover) entertained a nice audience on Sunday 2 November and the event raised £348 for Acle & District Poppy Appeal. Wally's Quiz held in The Ship, Reedham on Sunday 9th November raised an additional £120.

Our next meeting on Wednesday 3rd December will begin with a presentation "V2 Rockets in East Norfolk" given by Ben Milner, UEA Lecturer. This will be held in the Bure Room, Acle Recreation Centre starting at 7.15pm


