From the Rectory

Last month's Week of Prayer for Christian Unity highlighted that this year is a significant anniversary for the Nicene Creed. Some of you might be tempted to stop reading at this point (!) but stay with me – after all, how often do we get to celebrate a 1700th anniversary? This statement of the Christian faith certainly has staying power: we continue to recite a version of it at most Sunday celebrations of the Holy Communion. Because of its age, it's held in common by all Christian denominations - except for one clause which was added later and therefore doesn't appear in Orthodox versions. It was a desire for unity which led to the creed's formulation: to provide stability, not just for the Church, but for the Roman Empire. I've heard it said (I imagine it's not actually true) that the bishops were locked in a room until they came up with an agreed resolution - I guess many of us have been in meetings a bit like that! It also aimed to settle the Arian controversy, about the human/divine nature of Christ - hence the disproportionate length of that section of the creed (eternally begotten ... God of God. Light of Light, true God ... begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father). I'm sure that puzzled me when I was young; as did the complete lack of reference to Jesus' ministry - profoundly important though that is in inducing and shaping (my) faith.

I recall being asked a question about the Creed at my selection conference for ordained ministry. I can't remember exactly what I said, but I think I honestly expressed my lack of enthusiasm for it as a definition of Christian faith, but that I recognised the benefit of saying it together in worship. In other words, it's probably not something many of us would produce if we were asked to summarise our personal faith; nor is it helpful to imply that we have to tick all its boxes before we qualify as followers of Jesus Christ; but it is a definitive expression of the faith of the Church in which we share – not just with those in the room at the time, but across the denominations and down through the ages.

At the same time, I recognise that there are Christians who are enthusiastic about the detail of the creed, and inspired by its theology; and sometimes they inspire me. I guess Malcolm Guite would be one of them: he comes at the creed as not only a priest, but a poet. It was fascinating to hear him – and the familiar voice of former chaplain to the Bishop of Norwich, Susanna Gunner – presenting an Epiphany-tide Sunday Worship on Radio 4

(www.bbc.co.uk/sounds/play/m00274n1). Susanna summarised their approach:-What if the Creed opens up possibilities rather than closing them down? What if it is more like a map of mysteries than a table of rigid definitions? What if it turns out to be a story we can belong to rather than then a set of formulae beyond our grasp? Viewed in this way, the creed is an invitation to encounter the mystery of the triune God – through creation, through the Son, through the Holy Spirit, even through the Church(!) How could we, or the Council of Nicaea, define the indefinable? For to define means to place limits upon. We cannot limit God; just **4**. as our buildings cannot contain him. Like our church buildings, the creed, the worship suggested, is really a kind of lens to bring in to focus for a moment the God who is always there. In the love of God,

REEDHAM PARISH COUNCIL

Meeting held on Monday 6th January 2025 in the Village Hall There were 10 Councillors present, the Clerk, District Councillor Nurden and 3 members of the public. The meeting commenced at 7.30pm.

Cllr Hale advised that the Council have been notified that no election was requested for a new councillor, therefore the Council can go ahead with co-option.

Cllr George was unanimously elected as Vice-Chairman of Reedham Parish Council. 13.

Chairman of the Village Hall Chris Bradbury gave the following report: The December Cash Bingo jackpot wasn't won, the jackpot stands for January at £270 in 61 numbers or less.

There will be a showing of a film 'The Critic' on the big screen on Friday 14^{th} February at 7.30pm.

On 22^{nd} February I I am-I pm we are holding a jumble sale, there will be a roadside collection or take your jumble to the village hall on the day.

There is a road race taking place on Sunday 19th January.

Following on from the report of anti-social behaviour outside the village hall gates, an email regarding anti-social behaviour and littering at the water treatment works was received from a member of the public.

A planning application has been received for Reedham Old Hall, 2 Church Road, for the conversion of existing coach house and adjacent outbuildings into 2 dwelling units. The council discussed this and agreed that in principle they are in favour of the application, however they have concerns regarding traffic management during the construction phase, in particular emergency access to Joseph House care home which caters for residents who are elderly or have learning disabilities. The Clerk to make comments to Broadland planning

Cllr George presented the report from the social walk and identified some areas along Riverside where repairs and renovation were needed. The Clerk has had discussions with Broadland District Council over responsibility for the items supplied as part of a tourist initiative in 2019–2020, however it is likely that the Parish Council will be responsible for the cost of any repairs or replacements.

The Smokehouse was also considered, as it is in need of repairs, this is a district council asset. The Clerk to discuss with Broadland District Council.

Speed sensor - In December the speed sensor was located on the new post in Church Road facing west, collecting data from traffic leaving the village. The 85th percentile was 32.1 mph; the average speed was 18.8 mph. The average vehicles per day was 264.

Following a budget meeting the draft budget has been circulated to all councillors. A precept of \pounds 24,551 for 2025-2026 was unanimously approved.

Time and Date of Next Meeting

The next scheduled meeting of the Parish Council is Monday 3rd March 2025 at 7.30pm, in the Village Hall lounge. Further details will be published on the website, Facebook page and notice board by the Doctors nearer the time. All parishioners are welcome to attend.

Reedham Church Yard Maintenance and Ceiling repairs

Reedham Church Council is trying to arrange for a contractor to mow the Churchyard on a regular basis next season. We are hoping to get a Grant from the Parish Council towards this but it is unlikely to cover the whole cost, and the Parish Church already has essential calls on its budget which exceed its income (like the electricity and water bills and insurance). Please therefore support our Pancake Party on Saturday 1st March. We also are planning a Ceilidh with the same excellent band which Beighton have for theirs – but on Saturday 21st June. Write the dates in your diaries!


