I remember singing the hymn Jesus good above all other as a child; and wondering what, or who, was this Percy Vere that was promoted, somewhat oddly, in the last line of each verse? Perseverance is something we're going to need over the next few months if we are to keep Coronavirus suppressed and maintain our sanity at the same time, until the vaccination programme reaches an effective level.

Looking back (as we do at this time of year) we have a superb example of perseverance in our own benefice, which would have been more widely celebrated, were it not for the virus. Beighton's Rethatching & Improvements Project began as long ago as 2014, as a £21K, urgent(!) rethatching job. It quickly expanded to include further repairs and the improvements to make the church more useable which were completed this year, at a cost nearer £350K, funded principally, but not totally, by the National Lottery Heritage Fund. The project was steered throughout for the PCC by Fabric Officer and Treasurer, Kate Ashcroft, meeting the demands of funders for application forms and data; and harnessing the talents of others to prepare an ambitious programme of supporting activities. Midway the project suffered what seemed like a fatal blow, when it was turned down at the implementation stage; but the church was encouraged to reapply, even though it meant going back almost to square one. And there were other setbacks along the way: medieval roof timbers which required much more attention than budgeted; and of course, Coronavirus, which disrupted supplies, delayed completion and thereby increased costs. Overcoming all that would have been a remarkable enough achievement, were it not that Kate also went through the personal trials of losing her husband to cancer and undergoing treatment herself. Perseverance indeed. And she hasn't finished yet: a deferred and now funded programme of plasterwork should take place this month! Thank you so much, Kate.

Faith sometimes demands perseverance. Jesus told his followers to expect persecution, saying. Those who endure to the end will be saved. Perseverance can also be driven by faith. Not necessarily faith in our own abilities, but a conviction of the truth of what we are doing; belief in an ultimate outcome which may be beyond us, but which urges us to commit ourselves. Many people are quick to say, I couldn't do that; but in the service of something we believe in, ordinary people can end up doing extra-ordinary things. Those early Christian martyrs who persisted in the face of hostile authorities couldn't hope to overthrow the power of Rome; but their blood did prove to be the seed of the Church.

Something else I remember from childhood assemblies is Ignatius Loyola's *Christian soldier's prayer*:

Teach us, good Lord, to serve thee as thou deservest: to give and not to count the cost; to fight and not to heed the wounds; to toil and not to seek for rest; to labour and not to ask for any reward, save that of knowing that we do thy will.

Bill's father had died shortly before his birth, so Bill took on many small jobs, beet and potato lifting and fruit picking to help the family.

He joined the RAF in 1936, progressing through the ranks to become Wing Commander. In this role he saw out WWII, travelling extensively before retiring to a cottage in the New Forest with his wife Doreen.

Whilst he loved his life in Hampshire he never forgot his Norfolk roots and I was pleased to have spoken to him about shared memories shortly before he died. One of his special memories of Norfolk was a trip on the Wherry Albion. He has encouraged his family to take a trip in his memory.

REEDHAM PARISH COUNCIL

Meeting held on Monday 7^{th} December 2020 online via Zoom

There were 7 Councillors present, the Clerk, County Councillor Brian Iles, and District Councillor Grant Nurden. 3 members of the public were in attendance. The meeting commenced at 7.30pm

County Councillor Brian Iles is proud of the way Norfolk County Council have been dealing with Covid. Most employees have been working from home but services have continued to be delivered. Budget consultations and discussions are continuing. The

Council Tax increase is currently expected to be 1.99% with an additional 2% for 10. Adult Social Care.

District Councillor Grant Nurden reported that the Community at Heart Lottery was launched on the 5th November, with the first tickets going on sale on 12th January 2021. There is still time for any Broadland-based clubs, charities and not-for-profit organisations looking for a reliable free way to raise funds to register an interest in taking part. More details can be found on the Broadland District Council website.

The Community at Heart Awards ceremony took place on the 12th November. It was a virtual ceremony and can be viewed on the Council's YouTube channel, along with all other Council meetings.

No planning applications were considered for November.

The Broads Authority are recruiting a new Independent Person. Please contact the Clerk for further details or visit the current vacancies section of the Broads Authority website.

During November the speed sensor was located in Newtown facing towards Freethorpe, just inside the 40mph limit. The 85th percentile speed was 44.2mph compared to 43.2mph in May. There were 18,000 vehicle movements with 2,000 travelling more than 5mph over the 40mph speed limit. It is currently located on Mill Road near the school.

There are currently no plots available at the allotments but if you would like to go on the waiting list please contact the Clerk or any member of the Allotment Association. Councillors David Hale and Pat Bagshaw were appointed Parish Council liaisons to the Allotment Association.

The Council is considering compiling a list of local businesses and the goods and services they offer, to include on the website, and would be interested in hearing from businesses that would like to be included.
