View from the Pew GREETINGS & (RAMBLINGS) FROM AN OLD HAS-BEEN,

I will start by saying that I hope you have I had a Happy Christmas (depending on when you received this issue). And, on a safer footing, wish you all a Happy, healthy, and prosperous New Year.

We should, of course be celebrating the Epiphany soon with the visit of the Magi, Kings, or Wise Men, as they are variously referenced, with their gifts of Gold, Frankincense and Myrrh and, of course, their homage to the Christ Child. Epiphany is a funny word generally recognised as meaning 'manifesting forth' but in many Eastern Orthodox Churches is called 'Theophany' which, rather, means 'manifesting God' which, I feel gives, perhaps, a sharper focus on just whom Jesus (the purpose of their journey) is. At Epiphany I often reflect on the fact that Jesus is a greater gift to us than we (or the 'Kings' etc) might ever offer him. (A thought for another time - let's get back to the New Year)

I have, and do, wish you all a Happy New Year but do reflect on the fact that we don't all, necessarily, look forward to it with the same degree of enthusiasm (depending on our circumstances – and for some of us the new Government's decision to axe the winter fuel benefit may have a real bearing on that). And I wonder how you view the re-election of Donald Trump into the position of President of the USA? Is there any chance it could be a good thing?

As I get older I do find myself looking back, and reflecting, not only on the past year but over the last several years – and in particular on my ministry during that time. When Christine and I moved to Acle the intention was to retire from that ministry but, as many of you know, that wasn't the way it worked out and I reflect now that I'm truly glad that it didn't because my 10 years ministry here have been a real blessing to me (as I truly hope they have to at least some here).

A large part of that has come from spending time on pastoral issues – in particular leading services in Care Homes and Martin and I will, by the time you're reading this, have led Carol Services at The Limes and The Old Rectory again. While I was going to confirm a date for the service at The Old Rectory Christine & I were having lunch in The Vault (Cafe in Acle) when one of the Care Team from there came in with one of the residents (celebrating her birthday). We got chatting to the lady and were amazed to discover that she had lived in a village very near where I was born. Her parents were married at the same church as I did my 'Reader' (now 'Lay Minister') training placement – (what a wonderful experience that turned out to be for me) and where I preached my first sermon. It was a real delight to talk with the lady concerned.

So, perhaps, the start of a New Year may be a good time for us to take a little time out to also look back, and reflect on the many blessings we have received in the past and realise that there may be others yet to be enjoyed – whatever

our circumstances and expectations may be.

Meeting held on Monday 2nd December 2024 in the Village Hall There were 9 Councillors present, the Clerk, District Councillor Nurden and 6 members of the public. The meeting commenced at 7.30pm.

Cllr Hale announced that the Council have received official notification that the Reedham Neighbourhood Plan has been adopted by Broadland District Council and the Broads Authority.

He also notified the council that the Vice chair Liz Bassett has resigned and asked that a card was sent thanking her for her service to the Parish Council.

Chairman of the Village Hall Chris Bradbury gave the following report: The annual Bonfire and Fireworks display night was enjoyed by a large crowd, and over £1000 in donations was taken towards the fireworks.

The November Cash Bingo jackpot wasn't won, the jackpot stands for the 18th December at £260 in 60 numbers or less.

The Village Hall Chairman also reported that there has been anti-social behaviour with cars parking and dropping litter outside the locked gates during the late evening.

A planning application has been received for the demolition of the Gospel Hall in Reedham and erection of a residential dwelling.

The council had a long discussion regarding this and raised concerns about the following: access issues from the road for the property, access and traffic issues during the build, and possible engineering difficulties during the build causing slippage and subsidence. It also noted that the Gospel Hall is mentioned in the Neighbourhood Plan as a non-heritage asset.

The council agree in principle with the planning application but will make comments to Broadland District Council planning department regarding their concerns.

The Parish Council agreed to purchase a new public access defibrillator from Heart2Heart at a cost of £1500, this will be installed at the Humpty Dumpty Brewery

Work has been taking place to improve the Woodland Walk. The overhanging ivy has been cleared from the top footpath, new bench installed at the level crossing end and the top half of the steps have had the wire replaced to make them safer. A tree safety survey will be carried out shortly.

Speed sensor - In November the sensor was located on the new post in Church Road facing east towards Pettitts. The 85th percentile was 33.6 mph; the average speed was 23.2 mph. The average vehicles per day was 188.

Cllr Pittam attended a full day Carbon Literacy training session hosted by Broadland District Council. He reported that it was very interesting and comprehensive, and it indicated 'things are worse than we thought'. The information received showed that Reedham's CO_2 emissions are slightly higher than the Broadland and National average, due to the reliance on oil for heating.

The next scheduled meeting of the Parish Council is Monday 6th January 2025 at 7.30pm, in the Village Hall lounge. Further details will be published on the website, Facebook page and notice board by the Doctors nearer the time. All parishioners are welcome to attend.

As stated previously, you do not need to be a member of RBL or ex services to attend. We are a friendly group of men and women and offer a warm welcome to everyone. Teas & coffees are provided, with Social Club Bar open for other refreshments. We have a varied programme of speakers & presentations lined up for the forthcoming year, beginning with The Story of British Sugar, Cantley, on Wednesday 5th February.
