We are kicking off our celebrations of the Coronation with a special service for the eve: 7.30pm, Friday 5th May, at St. Edmund, Acle. We will pray for the King and for church and nation; and the Benefice Choir will contribute some appropriate anthems.

The following day most will be watching the service itself, either at home or as part of a larger gathering. There will inevitably be comparisons made with the Coronation of Queen Elizabeth II. There is no way that this event will rival that in terms of significance (or length!). Elizabeth ascended to the throne as a young princess, embodying all the hopes of a new, post-World-War era; one which we now know was to be contiguous with her long reign. We may well have now embarked on a succeeding era, but it is highly unlikely that it will coincide with the reign of King Charles III. Comparison with others is usually unhelpful. As the risen Jesus says in St. John's Gospel to the apostle Peter, as he looked over his shoulder at 'the beloved disciple' (probably John himself), 'What is it to you? Follow me.' Despite the weight of tradition, a Coronation looks forward, not back.

Nevertheless, I'll be interested to discover what modifications have been made to the service; and what those might reflect about changes in society and monarchy since 1953. A Coronation, with all the regalia and ceremony, is a richly symbolic service; but I expect those symbols have been modified or reinterpreted over the centuries. The orb, for example, in the hand of a god or emperor, originally symbolised dominion over the known world. Surmounting the sphere with Christ's cross, to produce what is technically called the 'globus cruciger,' indicates rather that the world is subject to God: that should then should define how any earthly ruler holding it exercises their authority.

We will no doubt hear a lot about service throughout the weekend – already signalled by the invitation to join in *The Big Help Out* on the Monday. That's in line with the example of Queen Elizabeth. But it can and should be traced back further to 'the Servant King'; and the example of Jesus himself to all who follow him, whatever their earthly status.

Meeting held on Monday 3rd April 2023 in the Village Hall

There were 7 Councillors present, the Clerk, District Councillor Grant Nurden, and 8 members of the public. The meeting commenced at 7.30pm

Chairman of the Village Hall Committee Chris Bradbury gave the following report: There were no issues with the play equipment safety inspections for April.

After 3 start dates have come and gone Anglia Car Charging should start work on the installation of the new EV car charging points this Wednesday and complete on Thursday. Fundraising: The March Cash Bingo jackpot wasn't won therefore the jackpot for April stands at £180 in 52 numbers or less.

The RCA adult theatre company comedy drama "Fitch and Pie" had good reviews and all the money raised went to the village hall.

We had over 60 entries to our Easter Egg Hunt, this is more than last year.

We will be holding a Coronation Celebration on Sunday 7^{th} May from 12-4pm. We are also hoping to bury a time capsule on the playing field.

Broadland and South Norfolk District Council's move to new premises, the Horizon Building at Broadland Business Park, is on track for early May.

There were 2 planning applications for consideration, notification of a road closure, and a renewal of a Tree Preservation Order:

- BA/2023/0106/HOUSEH revisions to previously approved extensions (BA/2016/0252/HOUSEH) including addition of 2 balconies – at Seven Mile House, The Marshes. The Council had no objections.
- 2023/0660 rear extension at 3 Barn Owl Close, NRI3 3FF. The Council had no objections.
- There will be a temporary road closure on Riverside between the 17th and 21st April for UK Power Network installation of new cables.
- BA/2023/0003/TPO Reedham Old Hall, 2 Church Road 14 trees in the garden.
 Replacing BA/2009/0022/TPO. The Clerk will be checking with the Tree Warden if there are any issues associated with the TPO.

The Council approved adding their name to a letter being sent to Norfolk County Council and Government Ministers to ask for the reopening of the Postwick Park and Ride.

Please take your litter home. A recent litter pick by residents along the Woodland Walk collected 190 cans and bottles!

The Parish Council starts its new election cycle after the 4th May. 9 Councillors have stood for re-election but there will be 2 vacancies. If you have lived or worked in Reedham for at least the last 12 months and think you could contribute to the village please get in contact the Clerk for further details on the role and responsibilities of a Parish Councillor.

Look after your finished spring bulbs for next year. Once they've gone over, resist the temptation to cut back the foliage. Instead, let it die and break down on its own. This will give you an even better display next spring.

Optimise your watering regime — watering early and late to get the most out of your water — and start collecting and recycling water whenever possible.

Harden off half-hardy plants by leaving them outside during the day and bringing them back under cover at night for 7 to 10 days before planting outdoors.

Prune Penstemon plants now — cut all the old shoots back to the base, providing there is new growth at the bottom of the plant. If there are no new shoots at the base, cut just above the lowest set of leaves.

Tie in rambling and climbing roses. Laying the stems horizontally will help to produce more flowers.

Continue earthing up potatoes. Pinch out broad bean tips to deter blackfly. Harvest rhubarb, picking only one-third of the total amount of stems.
