For the first time in my life I have sung 'God save the King' – a landmark.

As I write, the Queen has been dead for less than a week; although we have long known that even her prodigious length of days & reign must come to an end, yet it has still seemed to come suddenly & unexpectedly. Like so many others I haven't yet fully come to terms with 'our Sovereign Lord the King'; 'the Queen' still means our late Sovereign Lady Queen Elizabeth II, and not, as no doubt soon it will, the Queen Consort Camilla. I have no childhood memory of King George VI, although I was born in his reign; for me, as for most of the population, Queen Elizabeth was a fixture, someone who had always been there, a figure of permanence. Now she is there no longer, and the world is changed. We grieve for her as for a venerable figure, a conscientious, dutiful & hard-working Head of State; but also as confronting us so publicly with the common lot of us all, the mortality that is inescapable for every one of us. Her death has been commemorated in special services in some of our local churches:

'Into your hands, O Father & Lord, we commend your servant, our late Sovereign Lady, Queen Elizabeth. Enlighten her with your heavenly grace and suffer her never to be separated from you ...'

And now we have a King, at 73 the oldest man ever to come to the throne of this realm, and indeed older at his accession than most of his predecessors were at their death; a widely travelled man known to have pronounced convictions of his own; and if this is a concern to some, it is a comfort & inspiration to others. His reign we have proclaimed locally at Reedham: not without certain difficulties. The civil & ecclesiastical parishes agreed that the proclamation would be read in the parish church: but the impressively entitled PA to the Convenor told us that although she had the proper wording, she was not allowed to pass it on to us! However, our resourceful Parish Clerk found the appropriate text. Deputy Lieutenant Matthew Hutton attended and introduced the proclamation, Churchwarden Jonathan Lonsdale read it:

... We, therefore, the Lords Spiritual and Temporal of this Realm ... and others, do now hereby with one voice and Consent of Tongue and Heart publish and proclaim that The Prince Charles Philip Arthur George is now ... become our only lawful and rightful Liege Lord Charles the Third, by the Grace of God King, Head of the Commonwealth, Defender of the Faith, to whom we do acknowledge all Faith and Obedience with humble Affection; beseeching God by whom Kings and Queens do reign to bless His Majesty with long and happy Years to reign over us.

COMMEMORATION SERVICES FOR THE LATE QUEEN LIMPENHOE

At 9.30am on Sunday 11th a short service was held at St Botolph's to remember and pray for the Queen.

WICKHAMPTON

Following the death of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II, a commemorative service was held at St Andrew's, Wickhampton, on Sunday II September. A congregation of 20 people attended and gave thanks for Her Majesty's long reign and her life of service and duty. May she rest in peace, and God save the King.

REEDHAM

Also on Sunday I Ith September, at 4pm, a commemorative service was held at St John the Baptist's, Reedham. This was attended by one of the Deputy Lieutenants of the County, Revd. Matthew Hutton, as the King's representative. As well as giving thanks for the late Queen's life and prayers for the Royal family and nation, at the end of the service Revd. Matthew introduced the Proclamation of King Charles III, which was then read by Church Warden, Jonathan Lonsdale. This followed the formal proclamations which had been read at St James's Palace, in the City of London, the national capitals, & at County level at 1pm that Sunday. 'God Save the King' was then sung, and the Ringers rang unmuffled bells in celebration.

This was attended by Standard parties from the Scouts and British Legion, Parish Council members and led by Revd. Martin Greenland, Revd. The Church and The Palace asked that bells be rung muffled (essentially dampened down with leather pads) on the sad occasion of the death of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II. This we did at Reedham at 12 noon on the day following her death and other churches in the benefice were able to join towers across the UK in chiming their bells at the same time. We then rang open bells (without muffles) to announce The Proclamation of King Charles III, and refitted the muffles to ring for her funeral on 19th September. Ringing on fully muffled bells is an honour reserved for the monarch and very few people are old enough to have ever rung before in this way. Acle Churches Together held a memorial service for Her Majesty on 15th September at which we were also able to ring half-muffled bells.

On Monday 19th we rang at Reedham on muffled bells from 10am preceding the Royal Funeral. Bells were also chimed and tolled at Limpenhoe, Wickhampton and Halvergate.

We are very proud to have been involved in ringing for such momentous events and wish to thank people for their support and kind words about our contribution.

Meeting held on Monday 5th September 2022 in the Village Hall

There were 9 Councillors present, the Clerk, District Councillor Grant Nurden, County Councillor Lana Hempsall, and 3 members of the public. The meeting commenced at 7.30pm

There was no meeting in August.

Norfolk County Council have opened the consultation for the Norwich Western Link road.

Any residents needing advice regarding Ukrainian refugees should contact Broadland District Council's Help Hub. All Ukrainian refugees qualify for a range of benefits and help will be given in applying for these.

The Broadland District Council's Planning and Wellbeing portfolios have been merged and the new portfolio holder is Fran Whymark.

Chairman of the Village Hall Committee Chris Bradbury gave the following report: Fenland Leisure have quoted for the minor repairs highlighted in their inspection report, and for repairing the swing.

There were no issues with the play equipment safety inspection for August and September.

The tennis court root barrier should be completed this month.

The RCA Stage School performances of Treasure Island were very well attended and received some great feedback.

We had a few more people at a recent film night of Operation Mincemeat. Our next film showing will be Elvis on the 14th October at 7.30pm.

The July and August Cash Bingo jackpots weren't won. The jackpot for September stands at £320 in 57 numbers or less.

Mr Mark Smith was co-opted as a new Parish Councillor.

There were no new planning applications to consider but notifications were received for permissions granted/approved were:

- a) TPO 2022 No. 3 Hill House, 2 Middle Hill, NR13 3TW confirmed without modification 19th July 2022
- b) 20220956 erection of front porch at Rose Cottage, 43 Witton Green, NRI3 3HH full approval.

In July the Speed Sensor was located on near Pettitts recording vehicles entering the village. The average speed recorded was 33.4mph, down slightly on the last couple of recordings, however the number of vehicles has gone up.

In August it was located on Station Drive, facing Freethorpe. There were an average of 545 cars per day, which is down on 2020, travelling at an average speed of 33.2mph, which is slightly faster than previously.

For September it is still on Station Drive, but facing towards the Ferry.

The Neighbourhood Plan is now at the draft stage and nearly ready to submit to Broadland. The next meeting will be at the end of the month to finalise the plan. A copy can be found on the website and all residents are welcome to attend any of the meetings.

Several road safety issues were discussed, including parking problems around the 15. school at drop off and pickup times.

The Council received a grant from Norfolk Community Foundation to help settle the new Ukrainian family about to arrive in the village.
